

AF Victory in Brooklyn Construction Negligence Case

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In a recent ruling, the Supreme Court of New York, led by Justice Reginald A. Boddie, sided with Abrams Fensterman's client in its case against several defendants involved in the construction of a building in Brooklyn. The court denied the defendants' motion to dismiss, finding that they had waived the arbitration requirement in the construction contract.
